SUMMARY OF ELECTION POLICY FOR SYSTEM SECURITY, JOURNAL TAPE HANDLING, AUDITS AND RECOUNTS

- Creates minimum standards and basic procedures for county clerks to follow when conducting elections using Utah's new voting system
- Describes security, handling and storage of voting machine journal tapes
- Establishes a statewide 1% audit following each election
- Requires additional audits for recounts in races less than statewide
 - 3% for congressional races
 - 1% for county wide races in first class counties
 - 3% for county wide races in second and third class counties
 - 5% for county wide races in fourth, fifth and sixth class counties
 - 3% in races with district populations greater than 125,000 people
 - 5% in races with district populations less than or equal to 125,000 people
 - 5% in any other race
